## The Hidden Math of the Cheap fix

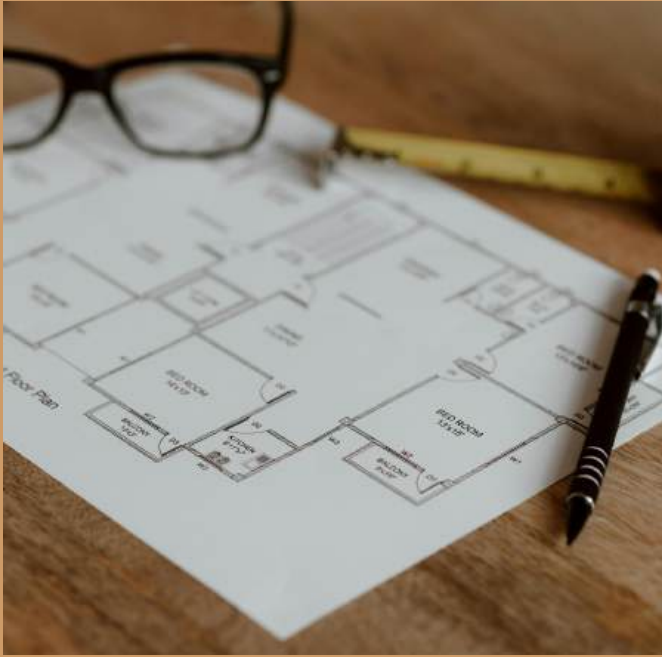

We often calculate cost based on dollars spent, but we rarely invoice ourselves for the time we waste.

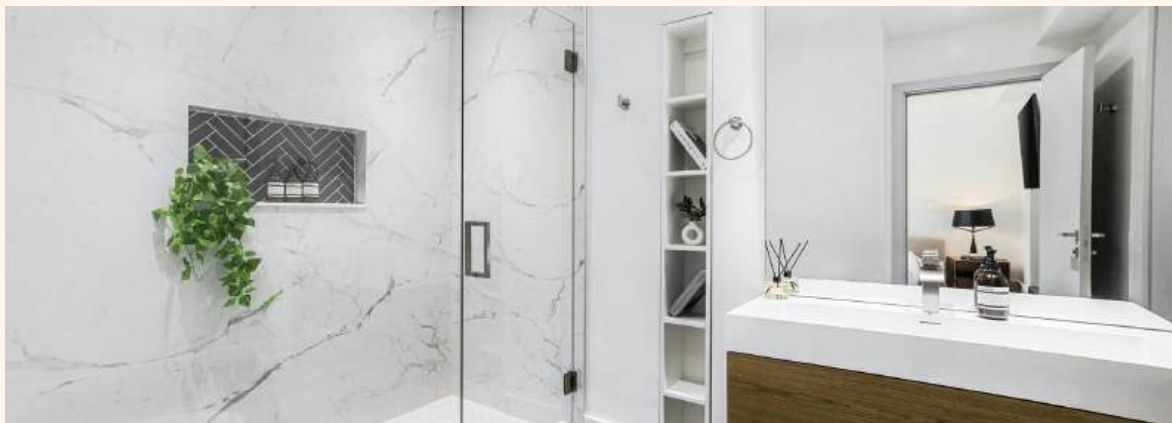
- **Quality:** Requires more time upfront for research, selection, and a higher financial commitment.

- **Rush Shipping Fees:** Paying double to get a part overnight.
- **Emergency Labor Rates:** Paying a premium for a technician to show up on a Sunday.
- **Limited Choices:** When you need a replacement today, you can't wait for the best option. You have to take whatever is sitting on the shelf, even if it's another low-quality product.

Flexibility	Planned upgrades on your schedule	Forced replacements on <i>its</i> schedule
Overall Value	High (Low cost per year)	Low (High "Cheap Tax" over time)

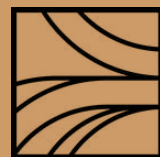
